How to Prepare for Roof Tear Off

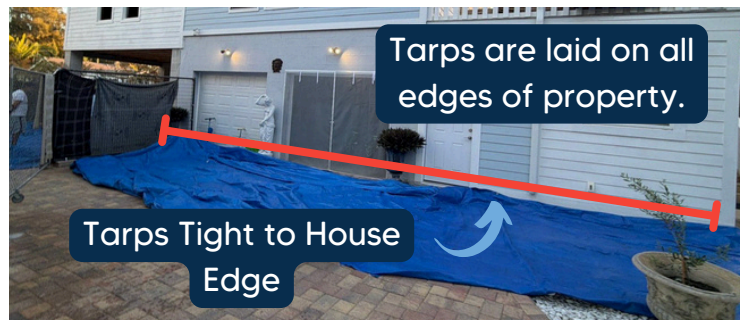

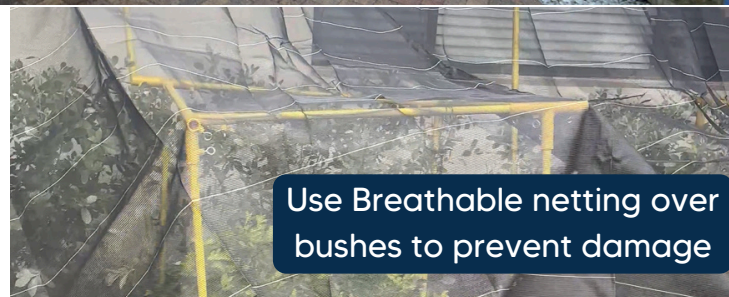


1 Use Tarps to Catch Debris

Lay down tarps where nails, shingles, and trash might fall.



Cover plants, patios, and walkways so they don't get dirty or damaged.



Tie or secure tarps so the wind doesn't move them.



2 Cleaning Up Debris

Throw debris straight into the dumpster when possible. Keep the mess small to make cleanup easy.

Remove trash from the roof often to keep it safe for workers.



3 Using the Catch-All

At Trust Roofing, we use the Catch-All system on our jobs to protect your home and landscaping during the roofing process. It's a specialized netting and barrier setup that surrounds the home to catch falling debris, nails, and shingles—keeping the property clean, safe, and undamaged.

Use the Catch-All netting system on jobs when scoped out.

Pack it back into its bags the same way it was given.

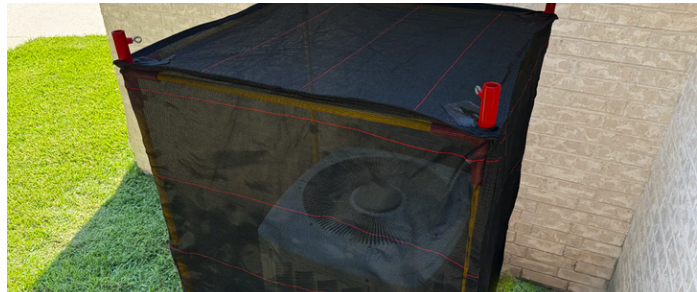

Protect the Air Conditioner & Screens

Cover the air conditioner with an AC cover board to stop falling debris.



Make sure air can still flow so the unit keeps working.



Place plywood against pool screen posts to prevent tears.

Protect the Driveway & Pavers

Put tarps or boards under heavy equipment to protect the driveway.

Cover pavers (brick walkways/driveways) with plastic wrap and plywood to spread out dumpster weight.



Plastic stops debris from staining pavers. Tarps in the Florida sun will mark the pavers

Next step is plywood which spreads out weight and protects from impacts

Cover the Pool!

Cover any pool fully with a strong, waterproof tarp.

Make sure the cover is tight so nothing falls in the water.



6 Move Yard Items

Move chairs, tables, and potted plants away from the house.

Keep them clear of the drop zone.



7 Keep Walkways Safe

Use cones and caution tape to block off work areas and walkways.

Remind homeowners to be careful near the work zone.

Store Materials the Right Way

Put materials in a safe spot where they won't get in the way.



Do not store on the grass—this can damage lawns.



Place near the dumpster, neatly and organized. Dumpster always gets wood block placed at trailer jack.



Keep the Job Site Clean

- **Clean as you go to keep the site neat. Always clean before going to lunch or break**
- **Pick up trash and messes right away so they don't pile up.**
- **Walk the site before finishing to confirm it's spotless.**

Who is Responsible?



Crew Leaders: Check everything on this list before roofing work begins.

Project Manager: Oversees these standards.



-Site Cleanliness In Charge: Every crew gets a site cleanliness in-charge who is directly accountable to preparation and cleanup result.

-All Team Members: Everyone helps keep the job site safe and clean.
